Early next year the first Nirimba Collegiate Senior Course Guide will be available to all Year 10 students and they can continue to explore their future curriculum options. This resource will be supported by careers and courses lessons at each of the schools during weeks 3 to 6 of Term 1. A Collegiate Stage 6 Information Night for parents will take place in Week 6 of Term 1 – more information to come early next year.

UAC and the ATAR – Collegiate Staff Professional Learning

Nearly 50 teachers from across the Nirimba Collegiate gave up their Monday afternoon on December 2nd to deepen their understanding around the ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank) and how it is calculated. This was valuable learning as staff often give advice about subject selection and the significance of marks and ranks in courses. Trudy Noller from the Universities Admissions Centre dispelled myths and

offered an engaging presentation that she repeated in the evening to a small group of parents. We will endeavour to run this program again at the Stage 6 Information Night in Term 1.

I am grateful for all the wonderful staff across the four schools who have worked with me to enable Collegiate programs to run, and in supporting the initial stages of the 'recalibration' process. 2020 will be a big year of innovation and change, but it is certainly a year to look forward to.

UTS STEM Day

Last month, forty-seven Wyndham College students joined with hundreds of other students from all over Sydney to attend the annual STEM day at Ultimo. The event was hosted by the University of Technology and was designed to increase student awareness of the study and career opportunities available in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

During the day students took part in hands-on workshops, seminars and panel discussions with past and current UTS students, UTS teachers and professionals in the STEM industries.

During the hands-on workshops, students engaged in activities related to various fields of STEM from building and understanding the load bearing of a structure to working as a thinker who helps other faculties to solve their data and work-related problems (interdisciplinary faculty).

During the discussions and seminars, students learnt about a very wide range of career possibilities in STEM, including scientists who help space-researchers with their preparation for space travel, and a biologist who is developing technology that uses algae to make plastics and fabrics.

The UTS Stem Day was extremely interesting and very worthwhile for students interested in any area of STEM, and a wonderful day was had by all.

FROM THE MATHS DEPARTMENT

The Greatest Maths Excursion in The World

The title does sound a little bit bold but you were not there. I was there. I saw everything and I still do not believe it. Now I know that some of you are thinking that this is the only maths excursion we have ever attempted and therefore the heading is correct but this is not true.

The Nirimba Partnership, comprising of the University of Western Sydney, TAFE, St John Paul II (Catholic Education and Wyndham College (Public Education) have formed a Maths Group that meet on a regular basis with the goal of improving students' mathematical skills.

Earlier in the year we conducted an excursion with the emphasis on "Bricklaying" and this excursion was considered the Best Maths Excursion in The World until the 27 November 2019 when our latest excursion, that was themed "Health and Fitness," took the title. I have no doubt that each successive excursion will outdo the last and the progression will continue with the crown being handed on to the next successor. I just love a series, one of my favourite topics in mathematics. Although, that is a lie. I do love then all equally. Get it equally from "Equations." Oh, I am a funny guy. I make myself laugh.

Anyway, where were we? That's right. Many students at TAFE and University are highly motivated but their mathematical abilities limit their success with their chosen courses. The purpose of this excursion was to motivate students to improve their mathematical problem-solving skills. To allow students to be successful with their chosen career path that may require a level of mathematics.

The students from Wyndham College and St John Paul II were formed into two groups that navigated their way through three activities. One of the activities was an individual assessment of the students' mathematical abilities. The students jumped on the computers in one of the computer laboratories from TAFE and accessed an amazing computer program that provides the students with mathematical assessment questions that calculates the students' level of ability. The outcome or level of grading indicates whether a student would be successful with a particular course offered at TAFE. However the story does not end there. The students will be able to continue accessing the program to upskill themselves. The clever computer program understands what level the student is currently performing at and adjusts the questions to that level and just above continuing to climb as the student correctly answer questions and declines in difficulty if the student is not being successful with their answers. Students can continue to access to the program after our amazing excursion to continue to upskill themselves.

The second phase of the excursion involved a practical presentation by a TAFE teacher illustrating the use of mathematics in the analysis of an individual's fitness and how to evaluate their progress throughout a program that you may have designed to improve their fitness. Various formulae were used to calculate these findings again illustrating the importance of mathematics. Some students were wired up and performed several physical activities and their heart rate was monitored to check their exertion levels to calculate if more or less exercises were needed to be performed to raise their fitness level. The combination of mathematics and the use of technology displayed a wonderful illustration to measure an individual's fitness level and heartrate performance.

The third activity was a presentation from a university lecturer who discussed a particular mathematics course designed to improve students' problem-solving skills and develop their basic mathematic skills in their first year of university. The course is offered to those students who are not quite ready for more intense mathematics courses but quickly develops the students' skills to "catch up" to other students and then they can attempt second year mathematic courses with success. Students were shown parts of the mathematical course and worked through various exercises. We also had the privilege to sit in a lecture theatre experiencing a snippet of university life.

Lunch was provided by TAFE with the Penrith TAFE making the buns that were delicious, but the sausages were extremely tasty, and they were provided by the Granville TAFE. There was an abundance supply of sausage rolls and water although some of our boys did try to eat them all. The winners were Rocco Truini and Lee Nakauta. Congratulation boys. Although there was no prize you deserve a high commendation for your efforts.

It was good to see that a large proportion of the group were females and all students provided a very high evaluation of the excursion. Well, it was after all the best maths excursion in the world. Thank you to everyone who attended, and we look forward to the next maths excursion, probably around June 2020.



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


