FROM THE COLLEGE PRINCIPAL

The final step in our subject selection process for 2020 occurred on Monday 3 June for Riverstone and Seven Hills High School students and Thursday 6 June for Quakers Hill High School students. These days were a realistic "taster day" of courses students wanted to find out more about. It was a great success. The students will now begin the "final selection" process of subjects for 2020. This will be happening back at their 7-10 campuses and is an online booking program. To finalise the transition into Wyndham there will be an orientation day and evening on 26 November 2019 for all students who are enrolled in Wyndham College in 2020. We look forward to welcoming the students to Wyndham College in 2020.

Whilst we will always enrol students from our collegiate partner Year 7-10 schools – Quakers Hill, Riverstone and Seven Hills we can only enrol other students if spaces permit. Currently, the College is at the maximum number of students it can accommodate. We have twelve demountable classrooms (portables) at the moment. The College will continue to maintain 5 classes in the Support Unit.

As has been the case in recent years, a 'waiting list' will be established for students seeking entry from schools other than the collegiate partners.

The special enrolment policy developed for Wyndham College still applies.

Access to Wyndham is through our collegiate 7-10 schools (where the policy of local area access **does** apply). This means that if students from the local

area choose not to attend the local DoE school, they will not then be able to expect to have automatic access to Wyndham. This is especially the case now, as it could mean that there would not be room for students from the partner 7-10 schools, and of course, that is not an option.

Uniform – now that the wet and cold weather has hit, we find that a small number of students are not attending in full uniform. Wyndham is, as our learning community determined, a 'uniform' school. We expect all students to attend in the full college uniform. We are aware that there are sometimes extenuating circumstances which could temporarily prevent the wearing of full uniform. All we require under these circumstances is a note of explanation from home. Most students, most of the time, do the right thing in this regard but I would ask that you support us if you are phoned by one of the college staff regarding this matter.

I have explained to students that there is no excuse to be out of uniform without a note. Another major reason for our uniform is for us to be readily identifiable on the precinct. We are experiencing some intruder issues on the precinct and the uniform ensures the safety of all our students and staff.

FROM THE YEAR 12 DEPUTY

It's hard to believe that you are a little more than a term away from beginning your Higher School Certificate. Your Trials are in Term 3. Please ensure that you regularly check your Assessment Booklet and make sure that you meet all your requirements and obligations.

Leaving the college grounds – The rule is very simple, DON'T! Once you are here you stay here. If you do leave then you are truanting and your absence will be recorded as such. Leaving the grounds also includes going to the TAFE canteen. Use ours. If you have issues with our joint canteen please raise your concerns through your SRC. It is empowered to speak on your behalf if you think you are not receiving the service you think you should be. Our canteen benefits each and every one of us because of all the profits from sales to the Library.

Uniform – Wyndham is a uniform college. We treat you as young adults and expect you to model young adult behaviour which includes complying with all aspects of the uniform code as you would be obliged to do when in the workplace. The wearing of uniform during the HSC is compulsory.

Dropping units - The College has a policy, based on a decade of experience, requiring students to attempt twelve units at the Higher School Certificate. Experience has shown that students who drop down to ten units with the intention of spending more time on the remainder very often don't. We find that one of the remaining five subject's drops down to being the 'last on the list' and before long the student is presenting themselves at the Higher School Certificate with eight units instead of the mandatory ten resulting in no HSC in 2017.

Help! – If you are finding it tough going don't forget there are skilled and caring people who are prepared to help you. We all need help from time to time, so don't be reluctant to seek assistance.







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STUDENT VOICE FORUM

This workshop was designed for students to have their say, their voice, on the current slogan for all NSW schools "every student is known, valued and cared for." In Year 11 Exploring Early Childhood students have been learning about Child Development in Unit 2. The status quo was finally broken, however not in the Wolverines favour. A well timed strike at the top of the box snuck past our keeper to put the Wolverines behind for the first time in almost a year.

Their spirit renewed the boys rallied, wasting no time with celebrations, they grabbed the ball and ran it all the way back to the centre for the restart. As The Ponds kicked off the ball was quickly stolen by the Wolverines who wasted none of their precious remaining minutes in taking the ball deep into enemy territory. Once again Bailey found himself with the ball just outside of the box, with little time left to waste he launched the ball towards its't target. The watching Wolverinoes went wild, the Wolverines were back in the game with their second goal in less than 90 seconds of play.


