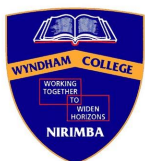

With just over a term before the Higher School Certificate Written Examinations, we are getting to the business end of the year. Year 12 are reminded that they need to meet the Year 12 Assessment requirements for each of their subjects to be able to qualify for the HSC. This means completing the Year 12 School Based Assessments for each of their subjects, (as per the Wyndham College 2022 HSC Assessment Booklet), as well as completing any HSC examinations. Please do not ignore Warning letters sent home by teachers for missed course work or assessment tasks. Complete the required work identified on the letter and submit to teachers as soon as possible.

For some subjects, the HSC examinations will just include the written examinations in October/November. For other subjects, it will also include HSC Performance or Projects. These HSC Performance or Projects all have submission dates in Term 3. Teacher will advise the exact date (and time) that the projects are to be submitted by and when performances need to be completed. Teachers will be providing support or opportunity to work on HSC Performance and Projects throughout the upcoming school holidays. I encourage all students who need to complete their HSC Projects and Performances to participate in the workshops/opportunities provided by their teachers. I would also like to thank the staff who are giving up their holiday time to support our Year 12 students to prepare for their HSC.

All Year 12 students were provided with a copy of NESA's 2022 Higher School Certificate Rules and Procedures booklet at the start of the Year 12 course in Term 4 2021. Please familiarise yourself with these Rules and Procedures so that you are not caught out by not following the specific procedures required by NESA for the HSC. Ignorance of the rules are not a reason for misadventure.

The Trial HSC Examinations are fast approaching. At Wyndham, the written **Trial HSC Examinations commence on Monday 25th July and finish on Friday 5th August 2022**. All students have been given a paper copy of the Trial HSC examination timetable and have been emailed their personalised timetable. Students need to carefully check the examination timetable and ensure they are in attendance, on time, for each of their scheduled exams.

Students, who are unable to attend an examination due to illness, will need to have a doctor's certificate indicating that they were too sick to attend the examination. This medical certificate will need to be submitted with a completed Illness/Misadventure form as soon as possible, to David Ryan, who will organise a time to complete the examination.

All students are encouraged to develop a study plan to ensure they are prepared for their exams and can perform to the best of their ability.

Year 11 and 12 - Uniform

We have two new items added to the Wyndham College uniform. These now available at School Locker. We now have navy shirts and blouses with the sky-blue logo and trim. This is in addition to the sky-blue shirts/blouses with the navy trim and logo. The second new item is the Wyndham black & navy hoodie. I need to remind all students and parents that Wyndham College is a uniform College. There is a wide choice of uniform items for our students to cater for the cold weather. With the addition of the new hoodie, all students should be in uniform as they can layer the hoodie with the Wyndham jacket. As we are part of the Nirimba Education Precinct, students are required to be in uniform. Thus applies to both Wyndham College and St John Paul II. Additionally, as we do not have fences around the school, we need our students in uniform so that we can quickly identify intruders and keep our students and staff safe.

We ask that you please support the College by having students in Wyndham College uniform every day they are in attendance. Uniform does not include leggings or track pants – students should be wearing the long uniform pants if required.

Underperforming Year 11 students

Most Year 11 students would have recently completed their second assessment task for the Preliminary courses.

For students to successfully complete Year 11 and 12 and attain a Higher School Certificate (HSC), they need to meet specific requirements. Students must complete twelve Year 11 units and a minimum of ten Year 12 units to attain the HSC. English is a mandatory course in both Year 11 & 12 with a minimum of 2 units per year. Thus, students need to meet requirements for all their subjects to attain the HSC.

This includes:

- attendance in classes,
- serious participation in the learning activities provided by the teacher,
- and completion of assessment tasks for each subject, including course examinations.

A student will be considered to have satisfactorily completed a course if, in the Principal's view, there is sufficient evidence the student has:

- (a) followed the course developed or endorsed by the NESA
- (b) applied themselves, with diligence and sustained effort, to the set tasks and experiences provided in the course, by the school
- (c) achieved some or all of the course outcomes

It should be noted that, as a result of absence from a course, the Principal may determine that course completion criteria may not be met.

Students, whose attendance is called into question, will be required to prove to the Principal's satisfaction, following a review of their performance, that they are meeting course completion criteria. In the coming weeks, I will be conducting Academic Reviews with students, who may be underperforming, and work with them providing support so course outcomes are met and they can successfully proceed to the Higher School Certificate.

Life Ready Program

Year 12 have participated in using **GoalHub**, an online activity that asks students to set SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Timely) goals that include educational and personal targets to assist with focus and motivation. Year 11 will be introduced to this early in Term 2. **Year 11 & 12** are participating in a session on Personal values and Beliefs in their long connect session in Week 9. This is based on small group activities and lead by their Connect teacher. Year 11 groups will also meet their Wyndham Wingmen again to assist with supporting them in the transition to our College.

Open Pantry

To ensure our students are cared for, the Chaplain co-ordinates an Open Pantry, located at the top of B Block, that students can access at recess or lunch via their Year Advisers. Basic snack foods are available if needed.

Student Assistance

If financial difficulties are creating pressure in terms of being in school uniform and paying fees, then a Student Assistance form can be collected from either the College Office or Year Advisers. Please contact a member of our team if you have concerns about your child.

CAREERS@WYNDHAM

The Careers Expo on 23 May was a very successful event with numerous workshops and a full exhibit in the Hall. It was open to all Year 11 & 12 students to assist with planning their pathways from school.

Year 12 received an email on the day of the Expo for the completion of important online activities. Students who were absent on the day, can access that important email. Students should ensure they are properly registered for NESA, JobJump and the careers classroom.


Many students are currently taking the opportunity to apply for university. They need to carefully check the deadline for early offer programs at each university. Reminders are provided in the Careers newsletter each week in the Google classroom. It is important to access an individual appointment with either of the Career Advisers to assist you with this process, if needed.

Careers@wyndham classroom (code – **uhzsid**) has been joined by over 480 students. This allows them access to relevant careers information, including job opportunities, current apprenticeships and traineeships, TAFE and TAFE short courses (started due to COVID19) and full-time opportunities, UAC, private colleges, university and gap year information.

Year 11 will be given access to a new type of TAFE course during term 3. It will be part of the **YES+ program**. It will involve one day per week for approximately 7 weeks. Students are encouraged to check the careers Google classroom regularly for the information around when it is released. The Careers Office, at the top of D Block, is available to all students. Parents & carers should feel free to contact the College with careers related concerns they have about their child.

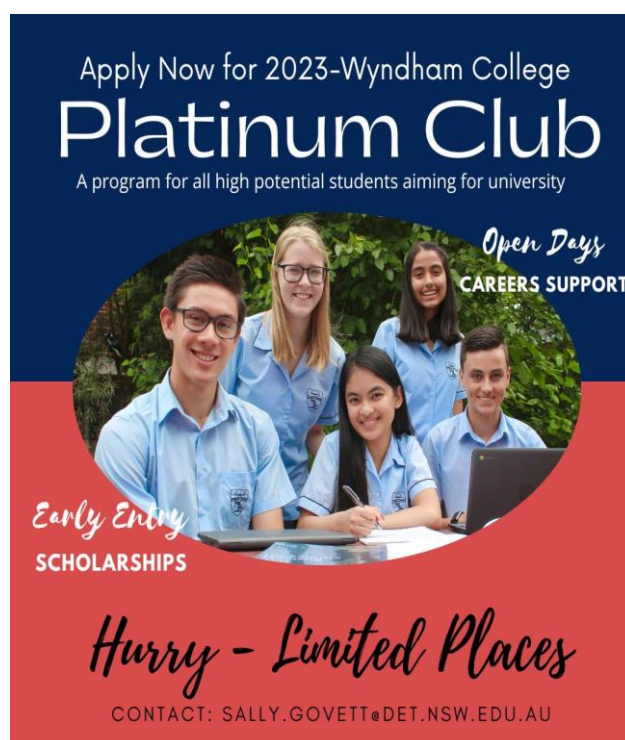

FROM THE TAS FACULTY

12DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY VISIT THE FRANK GEHRY DESIGNED UTS BUSINESS SCHOOL

Year 12 DT student have been studying the UTS Business School at UTS in relation to innovations in design and manufacturing. One of the most memorable and original aspects of building is its undulating brickwork exterior. It's been described as resembling "a crumpled paper bag".

The designer, Frank Gehry himself described the fluidity he envisaged: "The form of this façade curves and folds like soft fabric." His brief also specified that all 320,000 bricks were custom-made, differing from standard bricks with a groove in the middle. The unique design of these bricks allowed the traditionally rectangular shape to create curves.



Creating new shapes for bricks (see below) allowed the designer to realise his vision of undulating folds while using a material that, previously, had only been used to create straight lines and symmetrical arches.



Year 12DT have also been studying the range of sustainable practices in place in the building – such as drought tolerant plants, LED lighting, double glazed windows, utilising natural light and collecting rain water for use in bathroom and irrigation. These inclusions give the building a 5 Star Green Star Design rating certified by the Green Building Council of Australia (achieved in 2013). Additionally, the beautifully designed staircases encourage people to walk rather than use the lift and the inclusion of bike parking and shower facilities encourage people to ride rather than drive. These all contribute to the creation of an environmentally friendly building.

FROM THE LIBRARIANS DESK

Writing skills, described by an internal government report as the forgotten “r” in “reading, ’riting and ’rithmetic”, have dived across Australia in the past 10 years, even among the brightest, most advantaged students. Wyndham College, like other schools, is trying to address this, knowing that strong writing is key to success in the HSC and beyond.

One of the priorities of the Nirimba Senior College Library is to encourage closer reading and clearer writing by teaching writing skills and talking about good writing across the curriculum. Our students need to read and write with more confidence, sophistication and skill because improvement in academic writing skills will enable greater access to Band 4, 5 and 6 HSC results.

Writing is a crucial skill, particularly for the HSC. Wyndham staff across all faculties work hard to help students read and write with greater fluency. Writing can definitely be more challenging for students who don’t necessarily spend a lot of time writing or reading, so the Library has invested heavily in books the students might enjoy, including non-fiction books, recent young adult novels, as well as manga and anime collections. We’re trying to develop a love of reading and writing, so we don’t mind what they’re reading, as long as they’re reading.

One of the College’s challenges is to change the way the students think about their writing ability. In the same way many girls say they do not have a “maths brain”, many boys do not see themselves as writers. A lot of it is successful self-image — some think they’re good at maths and lousy at English, which is something we aim to challenge in the Library, as we know the key to good writing is reading. Boredom used to motivate students to read, but the activities available on screens today seem to leave little opportunity for boredom. Various scientific studies show that reading improves your writing and comprehension skills, increases your general knowledge, expands your vocabulary, teaches patience, reduces stress, improves your focus and memory, and even instils empathy.

Students should visit the library regularly and focus on reading one book for 30 to 60 minutes a day. Putting phones on silent in another room while reading, together with keeping a reading journal, reading the same book as friends and starting a club can also help with motivation.

- 4 Compare your measurements to the chart to choose the best equivalent size.

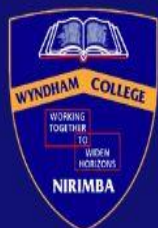

From your app, go into Settings cog in the top left corner of the dashboard screen, then into App Version. (See image below.)

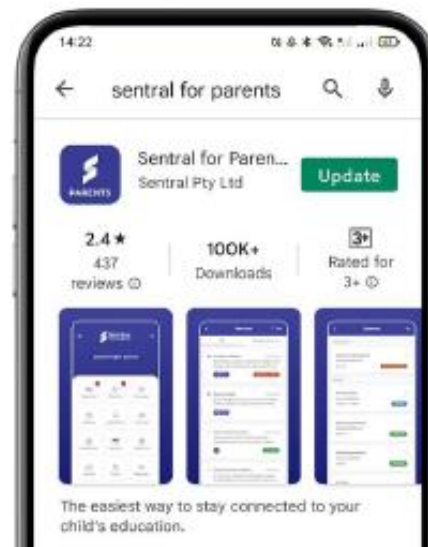


I am on Version 3 or 4

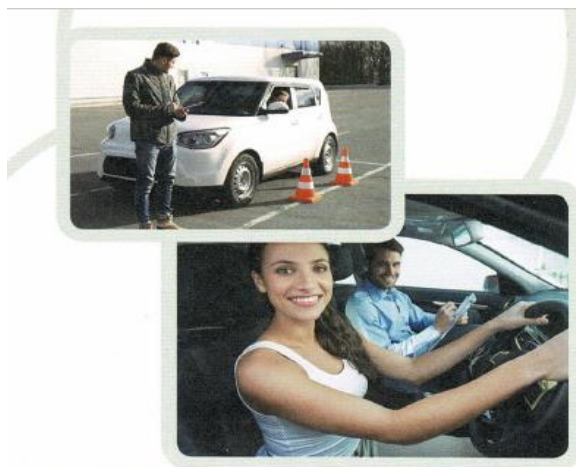
Alternate Carers

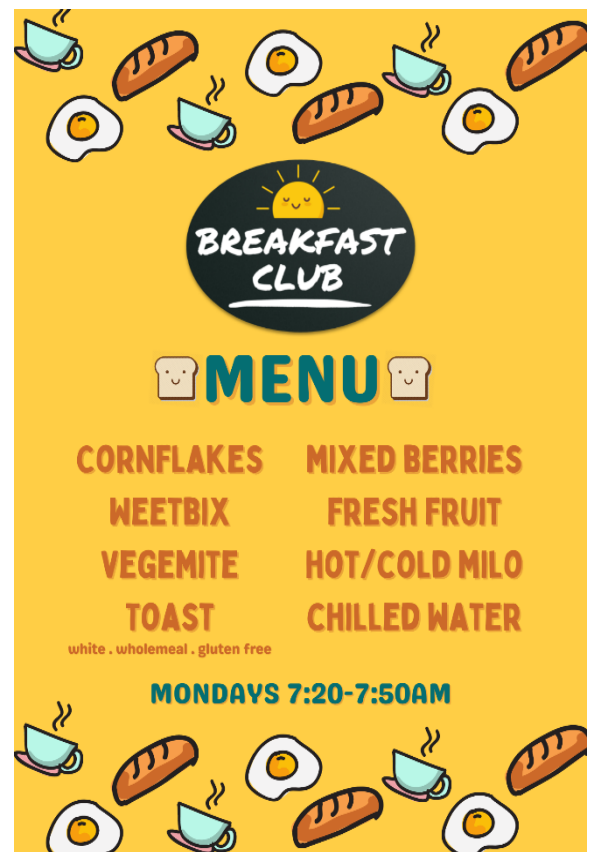

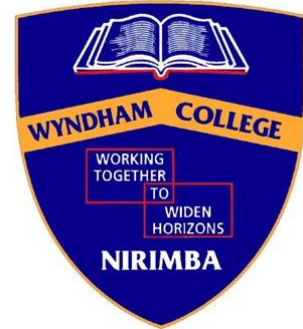

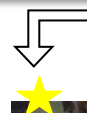
