It was very interesting and highlighted to us all the importance of remembering the people who fought and continue to fight for our country. Thank you to **Dimitri Papanis** and his team for organising this event and Michael Nash for presenting.

In Term 2, we officially welcome and congratulate **Beth O'Connor**. She successfully attained the Collegiate Deputy Principal position on merit selection. **Dimitri Papanis** continues to relieve as Head Teacher English and History.

UWS Agreement – The University of Western Sydney has again signed off on an agreement with Wyndham and St John Paul II Catholic College which not only enables the continuation of special access of our students to the university but also guarantees significant scholarships up to \$20,000 per student over 5 years. Students who successfully complete a university unit during Year 11 or 12 receive an early offer of entry to the university. Students who achieve a distinction or high distinction are entitled to the scholarship for 4 years at university (\$5,000 per year) and also receive a cheque for \$500 to assist them during Year 12. A significant advantage offered in this agreement is that Wyndham College and its students will no longer have to pay the tuition fees of these courses. We are again very grateful to the University of Western Sydney for this magnanimous gesture. We have started this process of seeking student applications for these courses for 2019.

Friends of Wyndham College – As stated in previous newsletters, the College moved to an e-P&C in 2018. This model has worked quite effectively to date. At the Term 1 meeting it was decided to re-introduce forums to compliment the e-P&C model. The next forum is Tuesday 28 May. The topic for that forum will be showcasing the College's new website, explaining Edrolo and the Parent Portal.

Our FoW is in excellent hands. I am particularly thankful to these people for the support they provide to the college. If anyone would like to join the FoW and/or attend the forums please contact the school and leave your email address.

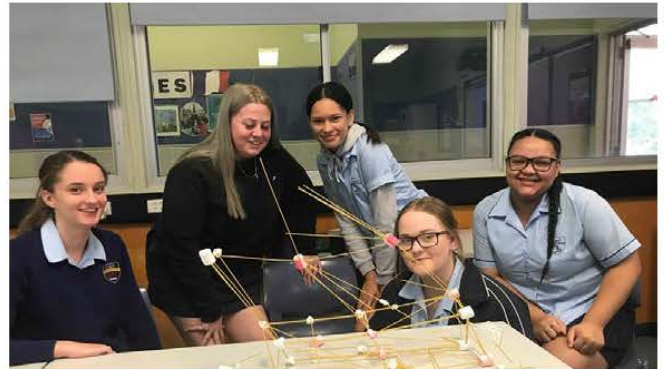

Year 11 CAFS students are currently learning about Leadership Styles and the roles that individuals adopt whilst in various situations or when completing tasks.

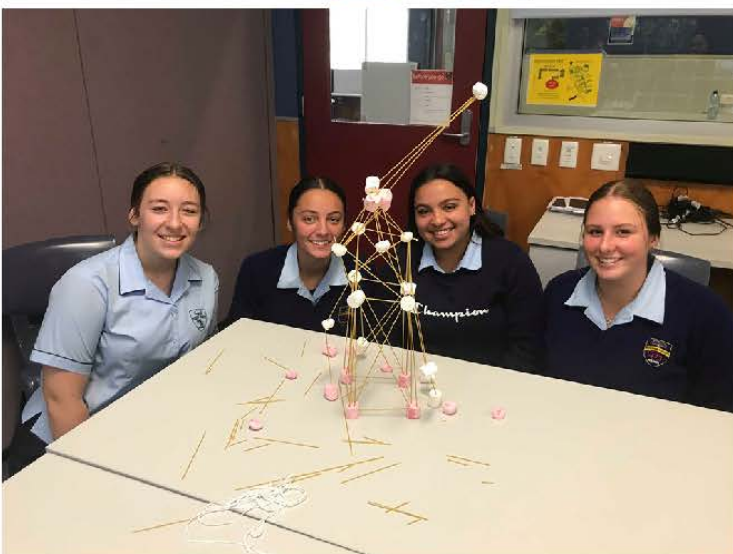
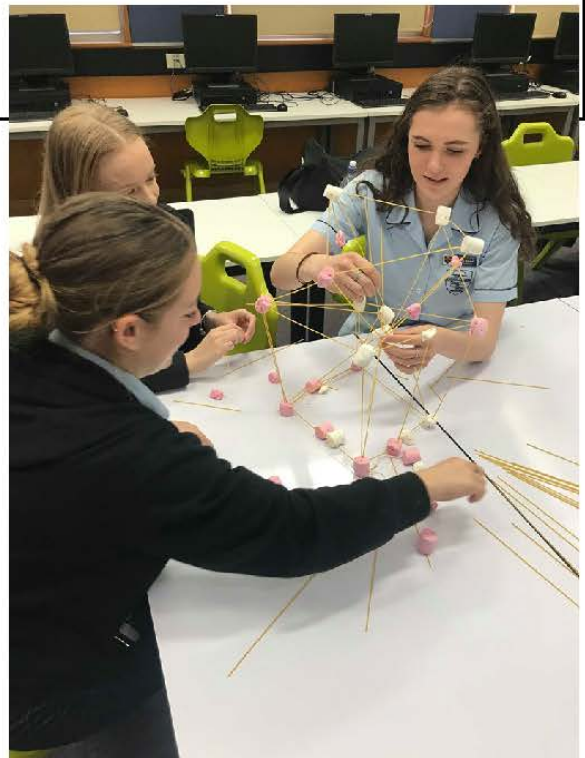
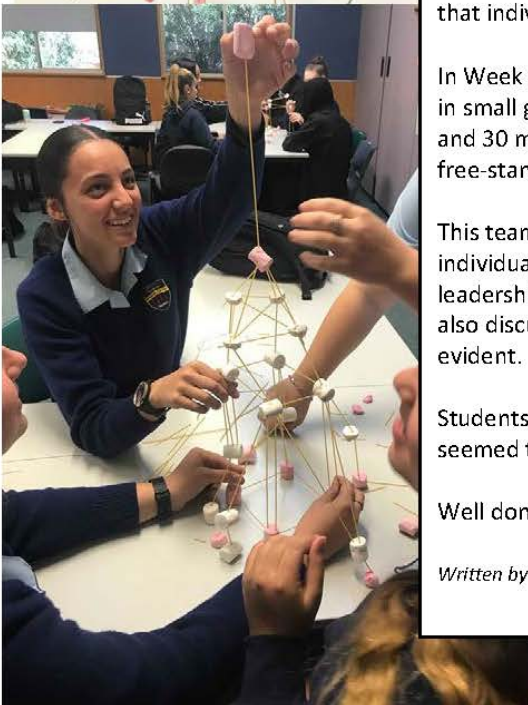

STEM Education

Bebras Australia Computational Thinking Challenge

Thirty two students from year 11 &12 successfully participated in the Bebras Australia computational thinking challenge in week 9, term 1. Bebras is an online challenge to promote computational thinking that relates to Stem and digital technology concepts. In 2018 over 642 schools and over 43163 students participated in the challenge. To solve the tasks, students working in groups were required to think in and about digital technologies, discrete structures, computation, data processing, and algorithm concepts. Bebras is aligned with and supports the new Australian Curriculum, Digital Technologies and the STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). The challenge exposed students to the importance of analysing and problem solving cycle as required in finding and testing a solution to a given problem.

Congratulations to the following students who participated in the challenge and achieved pleasing results. Four groups achieved high distinctions and 7 merit awards.

Once the ambulance finally did arrive Emma went above and beyond by volunteering to travel with the student and remaining at the hospital until his parents arrived, keeping both coaches updated on his condition. This was an unbelievable display from the girls and they were commended by both coaches and the ambulance officers for their quick thinking, without which the situation could have been a lot worse.

Anyway, back to the game.

With the game restarting the boys from Granville came out with a spirit renewed, playing with fierce determination to avenge their fallen brother. Some brilliant ball play from their attacking players even saw them make it into our goal square several times, only for keeper Mitchell Pugh and centre back Cayleb Senion, to send the ball packing time and time gain. After what seemed like an eternity of fierce first half play, a cross in front of goals finally saw the Wolverines find the net off the foot of captain Lleyton Coleman. We were up one and the first half was done.

With the autumn sun beating down, the second half started and again both teams were almost evenly locked, with the Wolverines finding space on the wings to open up the Granville side. With several shots coming agonisingly close to finishing, the Wolverines finally found the break they needed with a second goal to Lleyton Coleman putting Wyndham up by two.



With fatigue finally starting to hit the Granville side, the Wolverines saw their opportunity and unleashed an onslaught of shots on the replacement Granville keeper. With Josh Nweke, and rookies Liam Howarth, Peter Davies and Blake Steward all unleashing volley after volley to no avail. It wasn't until right winger and resident speed demon Mitchell "the razor" Fraser cut down the sideline to find our third goal, and only moments later bagged his second to put Wyndham in a very comfortable position. 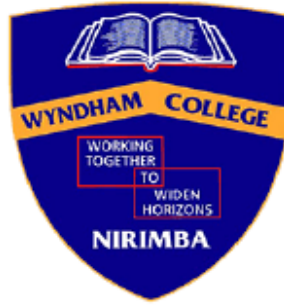

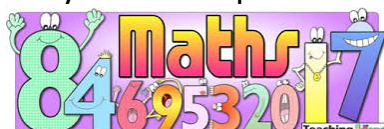

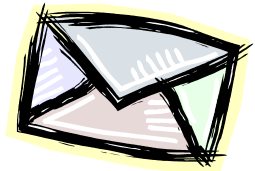
